There are enough ash boxes that fit very well under the ash pan to have all the ash, & burnable remnants emptied into the box. The drains don't do well with the firebox debris. No one is paid or should be expected to do clean up for you. A clean-up deposit has been *suggested* for steamers, yet it seems only one bay was left in such distress!

This is a 'play like a child' opportunity, versus an 'act childish' opportunity. As long as the 'fun for all' intention is brought by each guest of Train Mountain, we should see many good days.

I know many folks heard John Blacks' presentation on what he thinks he might plan to do to resolve the IRS lien against Train Mountain. What I don't see is a commitment to the K&W lease, or to the future members. He asks for a commitment to ideas, some of which have always been part of the agenda of Train Mountain; as is also in the agenda of the existing 501(c) 3 at the K&W.
