


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# Another Great Ops Meet -

First call for volunteers! The 2012 Triennial is very quickly approaching and there is lots of planning to get done. # Funding the Triennial:

We will have the fee schedule set by the next issue of the Gazette and should have the registration forms available online. There will be a separate bank account set up for the Triennial and payments for the Triennial will be addressed and deposited into that account. This serves two purposes. First, of course, is for the total accountability of the event and just as important is that in the unlikely event that the Triennial gets canceled for any reason, those funds will be refunded back to the individuals.

The rooms at Train Mountain are already fully reserved for the Triennial, with the exception of the Bunkroom. The Blue Caboose campground is fully reserved for committee chairs. So, if you want to stay in the Blue Caboose campground, volunteer to be a chair. Otherwise start making your reservations at the local motels, RV campgrounds, etc.
